Announcements for October 18

News from Church Council

Grace's Council and Finance Team would like to thank the congregation for their generosity during our Mortgage Reduction Campaign. Over the last two years we have raised sufficient funds to make a meaningful impact on our current and future flexibility in managing this major expense. Below is the status of our efforts:

- The congregation has contributed over \$70,000 over the last two years with \$52,600 since June to reduce our balance to \$369,000.
- Our Thrivent adjustable rate mortgage reset in September to a new rate of 3.625 % that will be good for the next 5 years.
- Our new monthly payment will be \$2764, which \$207 lower than our old payment increasing our financial flexibility in these difficult times.
- Contributions that were received after the deadline for the reset calculation will still shorten the life of our loan by about 10 months. Any future contributions will shorten the life of the loan even further.
- The Finance Team will continue to monitor the commercial mortgage market to potentially identify a more attractive fixed rate option for the future.

The congregation should know that they have a very capable Finance Team that has left no stone unturned in finding the best options for Grace. I would like to thank Tom Frederick (Chair), Bill Bechstein, Pam Adams, Jane Teasley, and Tim Dambaugh as the outgoing Council President for their work on this team.

Again, thank you to everyone who has given out of the abundance provided us by our Lord and God!
