Here you have what is yours.' ²⁶But his master replied, 'You wicked and lazy slave! You knew, did you, that I reap where I did not sow, and gather where I did not scatter? ²⁷Then you ought to have invested my money with the bankers, and on my return I would have received what was my own with interest. ²⁸So take the talent from him, and give it to the one with the ten talents. ²⁹For to all those who have, more will be given, and they will have an abundance; but from those who have nothing, even what they have will be taken away. ³⁰As for this worthless slave, throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.'"

News from Council

The Council has been keeping a close eye on your gracious offerings and the church's expenses during these challenging times. I am happy to report we are in good financial shape at the moment, so we thank you for your commitment and generosity.

The current fund income stood at \$125,710 at the end of October or 104 % of our year-to-date target of \$121.073.

This does put us at only 91 % compared to our 2019 year-to-date income of \$138,189.

Our expenses at the end of October have only totaled \$118,904, but there are some building and office maintenance items that will need to be addressed soon.

We are contributing the savings from the recent reduction in our mortgage payment to our Major Repairs Fund.

M&T Bank has approved the forgiveness of our PPP loan of \$44,200 and is waiting for confirmation from the Small Business Administration.

We will be holding a virtual Town Hall by Zoom meeting on January 24 to further update the congregation. If there are specific questions or areas that you would like us to address, please let us know. We only realize now that we are separated how much we depend on those face-to-face interactions in the narthex to keep our finger on the pulse of the congregation!

The Council would like to thank your Grace Gathering Task Force for their hard work in guiding the congregation back to in-person worship and limited facility usage, and establishing our current safe practices and procedures: Carol Johnson (Chair), Jerry Adams, Julie Auger, Jay Snyder, Jordan Irazabal, Tim Dambaugh, and Pastor Tara. The Worship and Music Team has now resumed the worship planning functions and you can contact the church office to arrange for limited use of the church facilities for the time being. The Task Force will now continue to monitor the state of the pandemic with the recommended CDC and government responses in case any changes will need to be made in the future.

Looking forward to the joyous Advent season to come!


