

Here Comes Spring!

Finally, spring is just a few short weeks away and here at the Hilltop Lutheran Neighborhood



Center, we are ready! Take the usual spells of cold, snow, sleet, and other less than fun winter weather, and add to it the challenges that COVID-19 has awarded students and staff, and you have us all praying for brighter days.

Over the last weeks, our children started to return to the classrooms though some continue to meet virtually at the Hilltop Center. As a result, we continue to

work with New Castle County to improve our connectivity which is coming along slowly but surely. In addition, Center Executive Director, Michelle Williams reports that we received a School Aged Remote Learning Support Grant totaling \$7500 to provide access for school aged children to virtual learning, both during and after school.

With the state legislature back in session in January and its Joint Finance Committee hard at work on a fiscal 2022 state budget, 'tis the season for grant applications. Michelle says the Hilltop Center submitted its annual Grant-in-Aid application for the same amount we requested for fiscal 2021, \$150,000. Meanwhile, the state of Delaware continues to offer support through its COVID-19 relief funds. A Delaware Relief Grant was awarded to Hilltop in the amount of \$15,000 which will soon increase by an additional \$3000.



Since its inception, the Hilltop Center has kept its students well fed, not just in quantity, but in quality too. Deputy Director, Brandon Furrowh, reports that in just one recent month, the Center provided a total of "over 19 hundred free meals for the Early Learning and Care children through the Child and Adult Care Food Program..." In addition, "we claimed," according to Brandon, "nearly 17 hundred free meals for school aged children."

As for the quality piece, our Youth Services Director, Teresa Allen, says "youth participated in



two snack cafés in December. Students prepared a healthy pizza using fresh ingredients like peppers, real cheese, and spinach. They also used a low sodium dough and tomato sauce." Teresa says the "children made individual pizzas that were then placed in the oven by staff. Youth also had the opportunity to try pomegranates. Staff introduced the pomegranates to students and held a short discussion to familiarize students with them. After initial conversation, the youth were invited to taste them."

No word on what they thought!

Finally, Center Early Childhood Education Coordinator, Crystal Ryley, reports that our students received a safety lesson from some of the best in Delaware, The Delaware State Fire School. "(The Fire School instructors) gave each family a 'Holiday & Winter Safety' toolkit that contained an activity book, crayons, and family resources. Families were also given hats and gloves for the winter season."
