

For those who are not yet comfortable with in-person worship, the service itself will be live-streamed on Grace's webpage and Facebook page so that we can still worship as a community gathered in many places. If you are unable to join us in-person or online on those Sunday mornings, please know that the services will be recorded as well and be available for the rest of the day.

In the event of rain, Grace's own scouts are putting up their outdoor canopies so that there will be some sheltered seating. For those who have limited mobility, you are welcome to park in Grace's parking lot. For those who are more active, we invite you to park in the bus lot of Cooke elementary which you will be able to access through Grace's parking lot that morning.

Although some of those who will be coming to worship have been vaccinated, a good portion have not and even if you have been vaccinated you can still shed active virus to others if you have been around those infected. So if you are coming to worship please be aware that you will need to wear a mask and please bring a lawn chair or camp chair for seating with you. We will be asking you to keep socially distanced from the groups around you even though we will be outside.
