


Registration Now Open for Grace VBS

Serving the Community

The big news from the Hilltop Lutheran Neighborhood Center this month is about an event which hasn't happened yet. At least it hasn't happened as of the writing of this missive in mid-May.

On Wednesday May 26th, in line with all Delaware Department of Health and Center for Disease Control guidelines, the Center is hosting, or has hosted, a Family & Community Day! This is big news! After a year of seclu-



sion, Zoom learning and Zoom relationships, the COVID tide is turning and social gatherings are coming back. This is especially great news for kids of all ages who have been separated from friends, some extended family members, and classmates since March of last year. Center Deputy Director, Brandon Furrowh, says the event "will include carnival/field day activities, take home dinners for over 50 families, and the distribution of 150 literacy kits to inspire reading and literacy comprehensions."

Fingers crossed, if this Family & Community Day was held, we'll bring you pictures on the church's social media outlets.

Speaking of meals, the Family & Community Day isn't the only locale for distribution of meals by the Hilltop Center. Brandon also reports that food and individual meal distribution at the Center continues despite decreased attendance at the Center, although you'd never know it, based on the numbers. During April (the most recent monthly figures available) "we claimed 3,838 total meals through the Child and Adult Care Food Program; 2,528 free meals for the Early Childhood Education children, and 1,310 free meals for school aged children." This is a fantastic service to persons in need in the Hilltop area of Wilmington.

Again, with the loosening of COVID restrictions, Hilltop is preparing for a summer camp this year. Last year's was severely downsized, but this year holds out hope for a much more, although not totally traditional camp. Center Executive Director, Michelle Williams informs us that "Staff is planning for both virtual and in person activities/events. I have let staff know that summer camp needs to be 'as close to normal as possible' for the participants this year due to the overwhelming amount of stress that virtual learning has created." We hope and pray for God's guidance in this important endeavor at the Hilltop Center.

Finally, with or without a COVID pandemic, the Hilltop Center is committed to keeping its students healthy. That's why tobacco education programs continued this spring. While we hear a lot about the impact of smoking on our lungs and heart, the Hilltop children also learned about an eye disease prevalent among some smokers. Center Youth Services Director, Teresa Allen explains that "they learned about and experienced the effects of Macular Degeneration on your eyes."

"In the activity," Teresa explains, "the youth were given googles to wear that mimicked the effects of the disease. They were then asked to perform several tasks. Tasks included tracing a line and tossing objects into a pail held by their partner."

"Although the youth did surprisingly well," Teresa concluded, "they spoke about the difficulty of completing the tasks with the impairment. Some said they had to concentrate 'really hard.' Others said they cheated by looking into the center instead of through the lenses. All agreed that it was not easy and that they do not wish to experience it as a real condition." Let's hope all the children take this lesson to heart.
