

SECOND LESSON: 2 Corinthians 8:7-15

⁷Now as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in utmost eagerness, and in our love for you—so we want you to excel also in this generous undertaking.

⁸I do not say this as a command, but I am testing the genuineness of your love against the earnestness of others. ⁹For you know the generous act of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so that by his poverty you might become rich. ¹⁰And in this matter I am giving my advice: it is appropriate for you who began last year not only to do something but even to desire to do something—¹¹now finish doing it, so that your eagerness may be matched by completing it according to your means. ¹²For if the eagerness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has—not according to what one does not have. ¹³I do not mean that there should be relief for others and pressure on you, but it is a question of a fair balance between ¹⁴your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may be for your need, in order that there may be a fair balance. ¹⁵As it is written,

"The one who had much did not have too much, and the one who had little did not have too little."

GOSPEL: Mark 5:21-43

The Gospel according to St. Mark, the fifth chapter..

Glory to you, O Lord.

²¹When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered around him; and he was by the sea. ²²Then one of the leaders of the synagogue named Jairus came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet ²³and begged him repeatedly, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live." ²⁴So he went with him.

And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. ²⁵Now there was a woman who had been suffering from hemorrhages for twelve years. ²⁶She had endured much under many physicians, and had spent all that she had; and she was no better, but rather grew worse. ²⁷She had heard about Jesus, and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, ²⁸for she said, "If I but touch his clothes, I will be made well." ²⁹Immediately her hemorrhage stopped; and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. ³⁰Immediately aware that power had gone forth from him, Jesus turned about in the crowd and said, "Who touched my clothes?" ³¹And his disciples said to him, "You see the crowd pressing in on you; how can you say, 'Who touched me?'" ³²He looked all around to see who had done it. ³³But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before him, and told him the whole truth. ³⁴He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?" ³⁶But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe." ³⁷He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. ³⁸When they came to the house of the leader of the synagogue, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. ³⁹When he had entered, he said to them, "Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping." ⁴⁰And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. ⁴¹He took her by the hand and said to her, "Talitha cum," which means, "Little girl, get up!" ⁴²And immediately the girl got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. ⁴³He strictly ordered them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.

IN-PERSON WORSHIP UPDATE!

With the temperatures in our area soaring upwards into the "uncomfortable" range, your Grace Gathering Task Force—in accordance with State and Local guidelines for indoor gatherings, has given the "thumbs up" to move our Sunday morning worship services, starting June 27 @ 10 am, indoors!! We are so grateful for the Lord's guidance throughout this pandemic and I know we are all anxiously looking forward to gathering again in "normal" fashion... and we are working on that! Please be mindful of the adaptions needed to make this happen for the benefit of our entire Grace family:

ALL are welcome to attend—Please **wear a mask** if you are **UNVACCINATED or** if masking up makes you more comfortable. Anyone who **HAS BEEN VACCINATED** is **NOT** required to wear a mask. * Reminder that children under 12 are not, at this time eligible to be vaccinated so be mindful of them as their families return to church.

At this point in the summer months, the nursery **WILL** be open and cleaned, but it will **NOT** be staffed; it will be available to anyone who wishes to "take a break" with their little ones and listen to the service as you feel led.

You will **NOT be required to sign up** ahead of time, **but will** sign in upon arrival for contact tracing, should the need arise. **6 ft socially distanced "pods" are still in place** and will fill as people arrive—if more seating is needed, chairs will be added in the near narthex area.

Please enter, worship, and leave the building in a mindful, socially distanced manner, and enjoy your "fellowship time" outdoors after the service.

Any further instructions will be communicated by Pastor Tara as needed; the **service will continue to be live-streamed** for those who are unable or uncomfortable with joining in-person.
