

SECOND LESSON : 2 Corinthians 12:2-10

²I know a person in Christ who fourteen years ago was caught up to the third heaven whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows. ³And I know that such a person—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know; God knows—⁴was caught up into Paradise and heard things that are not to be told, that no mortal is permitted to repeat. ⁵On behalf of such a one I will boast, but on my own behalf I will not boast, except of my weaknesses. ⁶But if I wish to boast, I will not be a fool, for I will be speaking the truth. But I refrain from it, so that no one may think better of me than what is seen in me or heard from me, ⁷even considering the exceptional character of the revelations. Therefore, to keep me from being too elated, a thorn was given me in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me, to keep me from being too elated. ⁸Three times I appealed to the Lord about this, that it would leave me, ⁹but he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness." So, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. ¹⁰Therefore I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities for the sake of Christ; for whenever I am weak, then I am strong.

What is this wisdom that has been given to him? What deeds of power are being done by his hands! ³Is not this the carpenter, the son of Mary and brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon, and are not his sisters here with us?" Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit let us pray as Jesus taught us.



Meanwhile, Hilltop Youth Services Director, Teresa Allen says changes were made to this year's camp curriculum to

supplement the knowledge missed by the COVID based learning opportunities this past school year. "I have created a new lesson plan to address added summer enrichment areas. Some of those areas include: technology education, summer reading program, STEM and STEAM projects and math games." In addition, Teresa says she "hopes to lessen the summer learning slide with the addition of the aforementioned enrichment



offerings." But the effort does not end there. Teresa reports that "a materials list is currently being compiled to provide summer reading books and activities to support learning throughout the summer months. Science and STEM/STEAM books have been purchased to assist our staff in engaging our scholars in fun and rigorous activities."

Finally, the COVID pandemic is not quite over and the subject remains a part of nearly all Center activities. Executive Director Williams says Center administrators and staff are doing their part to become educated about the vaccines and their impact. "COVID-19 vaccine information/events continue to be distributed to and posted for staff and families. Dr. Marshala Lee, Christiana Care, came to the full staff meeting to talk to staff about the effectiveness and safety of the vaccine. She also answered questions that staff had about hesitancy in getting the vaccine. Staff enjoyed the discussion with her."

IN-PERSON WORSHIP UPDATE!

With the temperatures in our area soaring upwards into the "uncomfortable" range, your Grace Gathering Task Force—in accordance with State and Local guidelines for indoor gatherings, has given the "thumbs up" to move our Sunday morning worship services, starting **June 27 @ 10 am**, indoors!! Please be mindful of the adaptions needed to make this happen for the benefit of our entire Grace family:

- ALL are welcome to attend—Please **wear a mask** if you are **UNVACCINATED or** if masking up makes you more comfortable. Anyone who **HAS BEEN VACCINATED** is **NOT** required to wear a mask. * Reminder that children under 12 are not, at this time eligible to be vaccinated so be mindful of them as their families return to church.
- At this point in the summer months, the nursery **WILL** be open and cleaned, but it will **NOT** be staffed; it will be available to anyone who wishes to "take a break" with their little ones and listen to the service as you feel led.
- You will **NOT be required to sign up** ahead of time, **but will** sign in upon arrival for contact tracing, should the need arise. **6 ft socially distanced "pods" are still in place** and will fill as people arrive—if more seating is needed, chairs will be added in the near narthex area. Please enter, worship, and leave the building in a mindful, socially distanced manner, and enjoy your "fellowship time" outdoors after the service.

Any further instructions will be communicated by Pastor Tara as needed; the **service will continue to be live-streamed** for those who are unable or uncomfortable with joining in-person.
