





Setting Goals and Objectives at Hilltop

A month into the new school year and educational activities are back up to speed at the Hilltop Lutheran Neighborhood Center in Wilmington. No where is this more evident than in the Center's after school program known as "Latchkey."



Center Youth Services Coordinator, Teresa Allen says Latchkey "extends the school day learning through clubs, academic learning centers, and enrichment activities." Those learning centers focus on "math, literacy and science/STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math)." "Art, technology and social emotional/cultural activities" will also be emphasized throughout the school year.

Teresa points out that "each month will include a main theme with connected subthemes." In addition, "there will be objectives associated with each month's theme."

Those objectives include and require that each student "participant will be able to:

Understand and follow the program schedule and articulate program expectations

Understand the 4 to score behavior matrix

Build relationships with group members

Understand the composition of the community in which they are a member

Understand and articulate the program reward system and earn 'Latchkey bucks' for hilltop store."

With the beginning of the school year comes an emphasis, not only on learning, but on good health. This seems especially appropriate since health issues are on everybody's mind these days. Center Deputy Director, Brandon Furrowh says Hilltop began offering "Community Wellness Advocates (CWAs)" in September and will offer at least 3 more. "The CWAs have been identified and preliminary assessments have been conducted to determine which program will work best for each individual to connected with."



This final piece of information comes more as a public service announcement. Back in August, while shopping for the Center's summer barbecue, a Center employee noted that "the catalytic converters were stolen from both (Center) vans." Center Executive Director, Michelle Williams says "Wilmington Police came and did the report and escalated the theft to the detective unit because they said it is a problem statewide." This is indeed becoming

a growing statewide issue, not just something going on in "big cities." The catalytic converter on this reporter's vehicle was stolen from inside a gated storage area in Cheswold, DE, also in August. According to police, the thieves sell the converters for their metals, the money from which is used to feed drug habits.
