

In light of the continuing high levels of community transmission of COVID in New Castle County, the Grace Gathering Task Force has recommended that in-person worship and Sunday Christian education for all ages be held virtually until February 20th. The Task Force notes that case rates, hospitalizations and other measures of public health impact may have recently peaked in New Castle County. The Task Force will continue to monitor these statistics and guidance from state and national government agencies. We are scheduled to meet again on February 15th to assess conditions and make recommendations to Grace leadership concerning resumption of in-person worship and appropriate safety precautions.
