



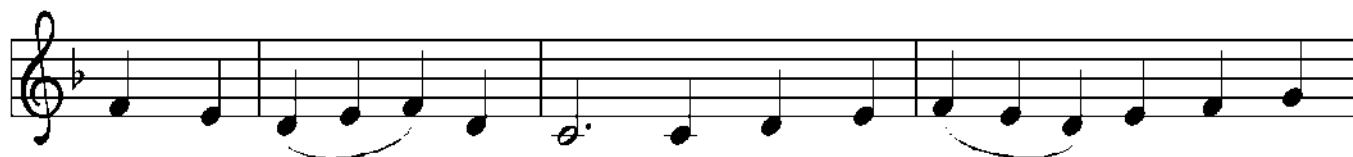

Church Building Expansion

In the early to mid 1990s, it was becoming obvious that our building was not big enough to support our growing ministry. What had started as a mission start congregation with limited space was now beginning to need some more room. For those of you that remember the old, cramped narthex and the elbow to elbow coffee hour between services and the Sunday School trailer out back, there was an obvious, desperate need for more space. During that time the Holy Spirit moved us as a congregation to discern that we needed a building expansion that included a new narthex, more classrooms, an expanded office area and a choir room. It was amazing as the project took shape and the fund raising got into high gear. Once the first ground was broken it took about a year to finish the expansion. To save money we painted the walls ourselves. There were many Saturday painting parties that did that great work and built community as we got to know each other better. Looking back it was yet another evidence of God's blessings on our congregation. One that would serve us well long into the future.

New Capital Campaign for Grace

As Pastor Tara mentioned during announcements at our wonderful 50th anniversary last Sunday, with celebration comes the anticipated need to address some long-term property issues at Grace. The flat roof over the core building is actually the original roof, which puts it at around 45 years old, while roofs of this type have a normal lifespan of 25+ years. There have been many repairs in recent years to patch leaks and our roof maintenance contractor has been recommending replacement to address this problem. Understandably, this has been avoided as long as possible due to the cost, which was recently estimated at nearly \$100,000. In addition, we have an HVAC unit that will likely need replacing in the next few years with a previous estimate of almost \$10,000.

Your Council had the foresight about a year ago to start an accrual in a Major Repairs fund to address smaller projects like the HVAC, but not such a larger expenditure like the roof. Consequently, Council has approved a new Capital Campaign to address the roof and will be bringing further details and a vote for approval of this expenditure before the congregation in a Congregational Meeting scheduled for Consecration Sunday on May 1. An agenda will be published at a later date. We do not anticipate needing the full amount for the roof from this capital campaign, but we will need it promptly to have the work completed in a timely fashion before further maintenance work is needed on the roof. Any contributions you can provide now will enable our long-term mission for Grace in our next 50 years!
