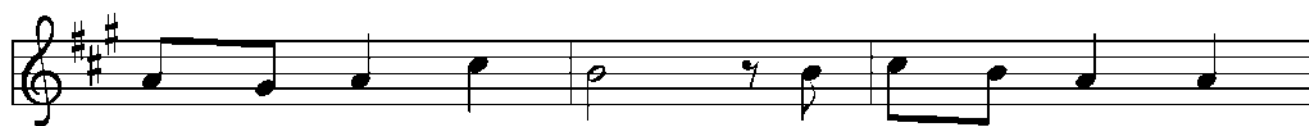

Dear Grace Family,

We have discovered disturbing news this week that some offering checks that were mailed to Grace were intercepted and deposited somewhere else. That is, they never reached Grace. We are making reports to authorities, and we are investing in a more secure mail storage, but we wanted to let the congregation know that checks mailed in August or September may not have been deposited to Grace's bank account. If you mailed offering checks to Grace, you should contact our Financial Secretary, Gerry Teig (gerryteig@gmail.com) (610-574-1304), to see if Grace has received your check. You will need to notify your bank if a check has been deposited somewhere else so that they can investigate and recover those funds. We are aware that some checks that were mailed in September are missing but have not yet been deposited, so you may wish to stop payment.

Please hold off on mailing additional checks until congregational leaders let you know that we feel our mail is secure. We would recommend that, if you normally send checks through your bank, you consider using tithe.ly which can be set up through the "Give" button on the top right corner of our website at www.glcde.org or drop them off at the church office.

Roof Replacement Project – September 28, 2022 Update

Tri-State Roofers are scheduled to begin the roof project the week of October 10. The project should take several weeks as they need to coordinate work with our contractor for the roof HVAC units.

- 1st Phase pledges - **\$114,785**
- 2nd Phase pledges - **\$5950**
- Current surplus funds - **\$107,000**
- Total available funds for roof project - **\$227,735**
- **Congregation approved expenditure for roof project— \$250,000**
