



in him the Gentiles shall hope.”

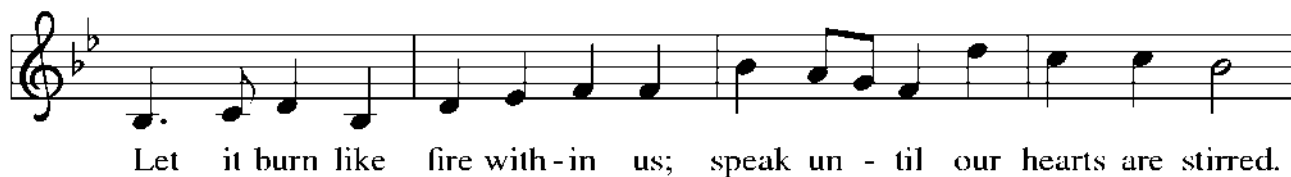
