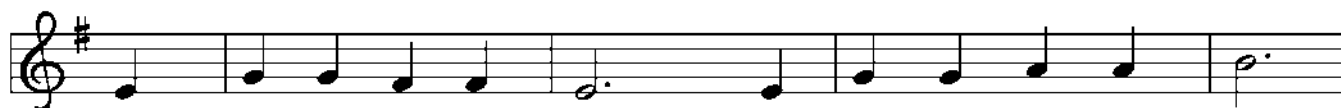

¹² and again Isaiah says,

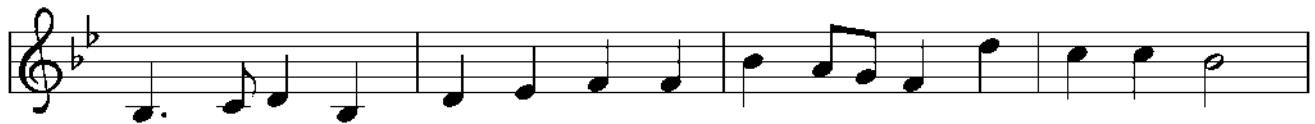
“The root of Jesse shall come,



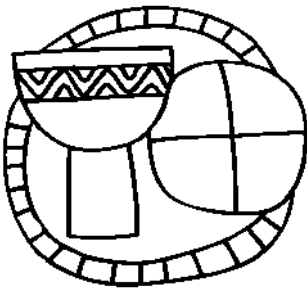

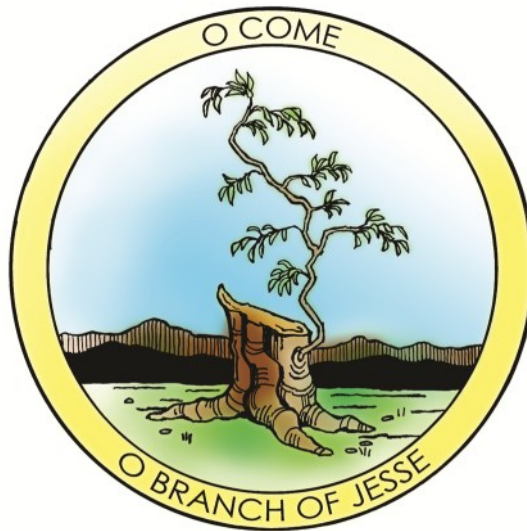
